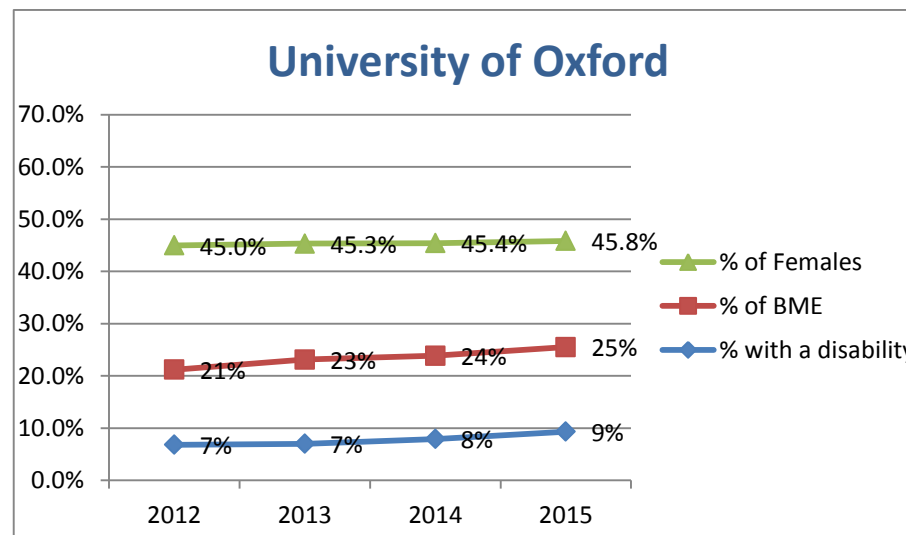
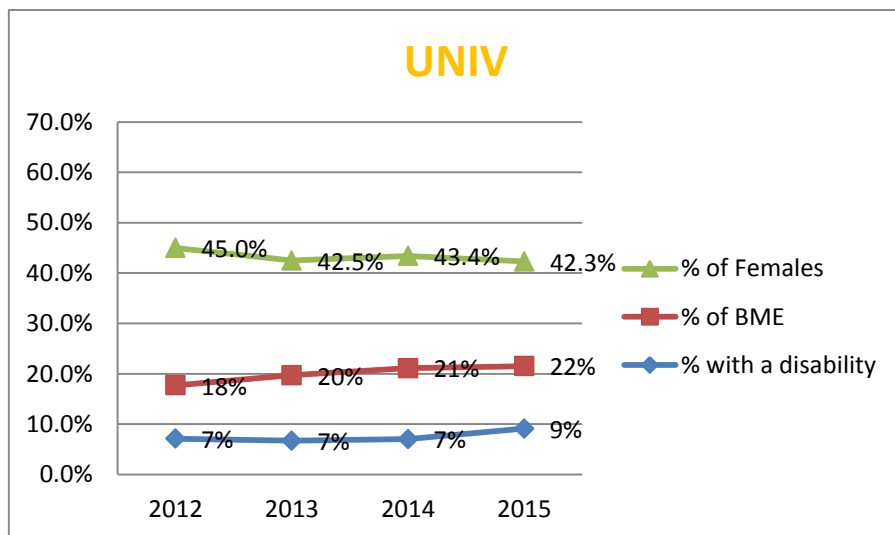

Equality Data for Students

I. Number of Enrolled Students

The following charts, derived from the University of Oxford on course reports, show the changing percentage of female, BME (black and minority ethnic) and disabled students between 2012 and 2015. (NB The on-course reports show diversity as a percentage of the enrolled population at December 2015)



Female Students

The intake of female students is broadly similar at Univ and Oxford University. However, the trend has been slightly downwards at Univ, decreasing from 45% in 2012 to approx 43% in 2013 and then 42% in 2015, whereas it has remained fairly steady in the University overall at around 45% from 2012 to 2014 and then rising to 46% in 2015.

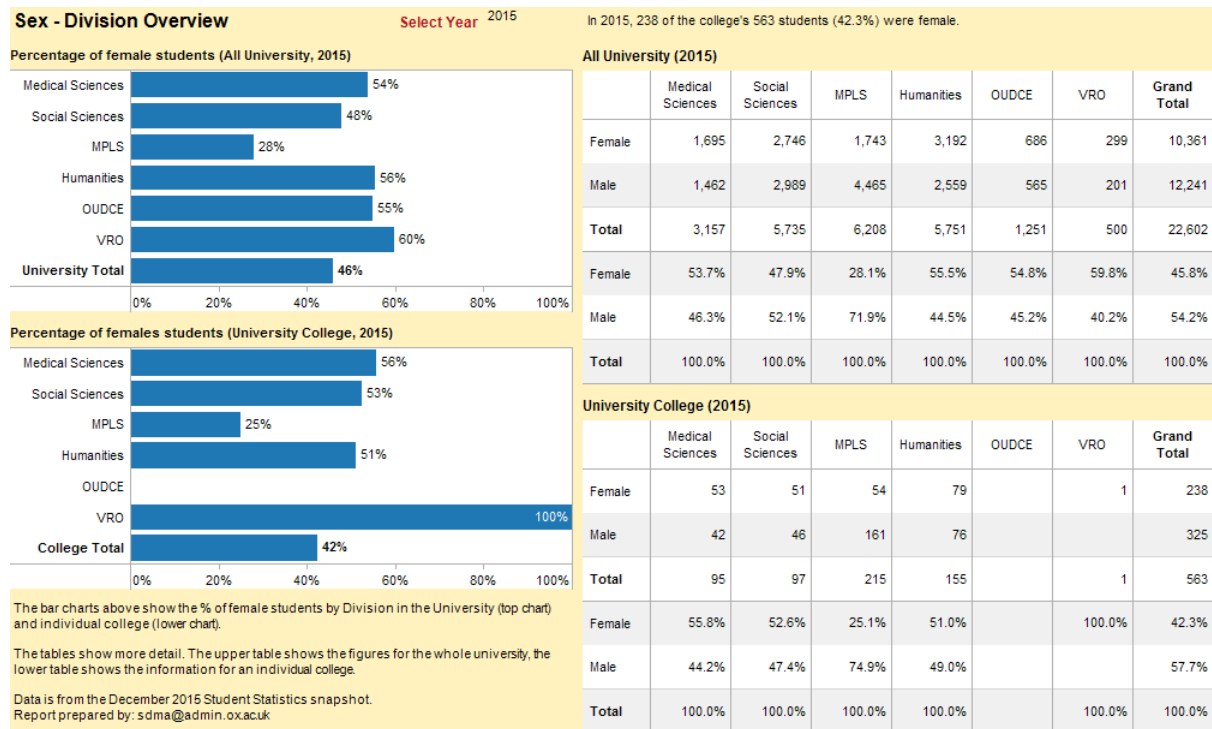
BME students

The University of Oxford figures show a slightly higher intake of BME students by 2 to 3% each year compared to UNIV figures.

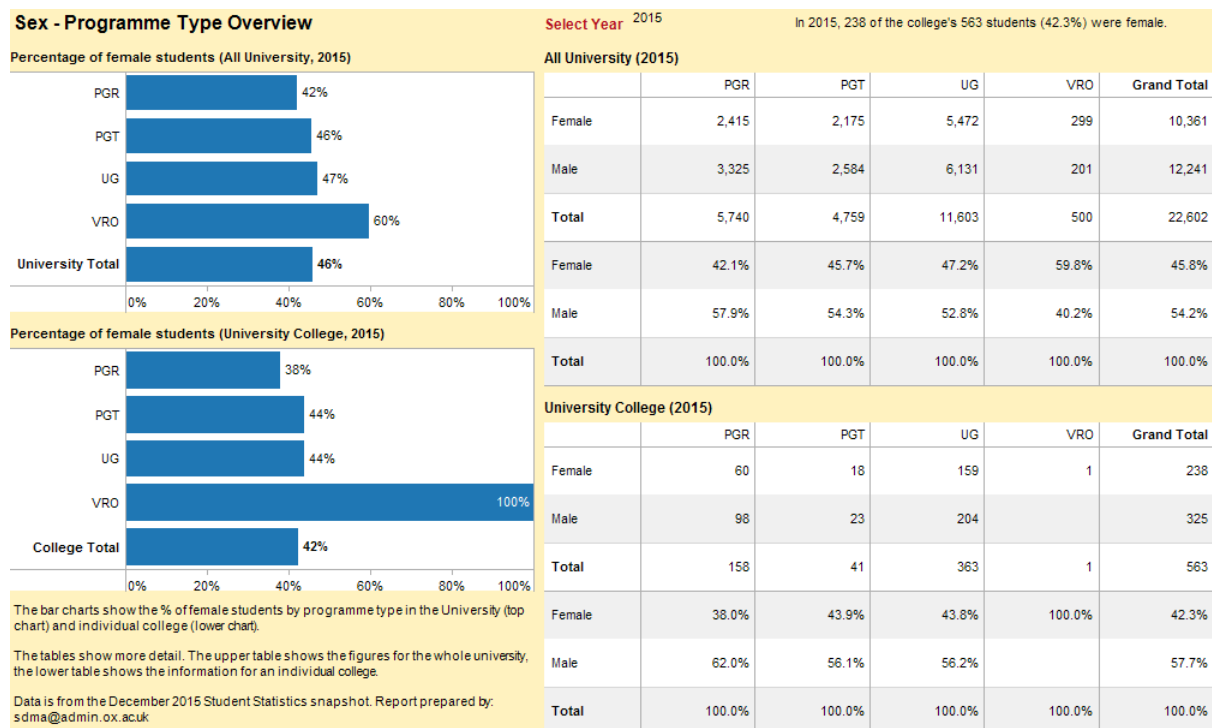
Disabled Students

The intake of students with a disability is broadly similar at Univ and Oxford University, with only 2014 showing a difference where Univ is slightly higher.

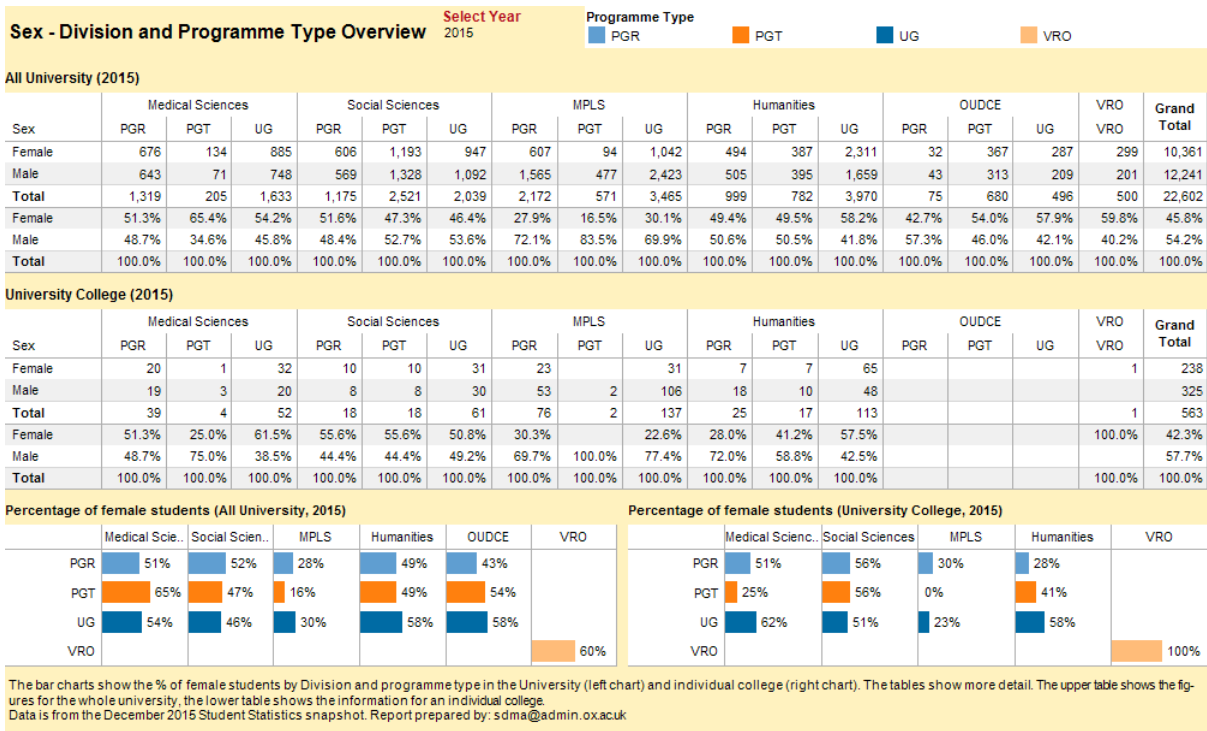
II. Sex, Ethnicity and Disability Figures



At Univ, the percentage of women is highest in the Medical Sciences (56%), which is higher than the overall University figure (54%). The figures were last reviewed in 2012 and showed a similar trend. The proportion of women in MPLS is still low at Univ (25%) and in the University (28%) and lower than in 2012, when the figures were approx. 30% and 33% respectively.



At Univ, women account for only 38% of PGR students. This is a little lower than the proportion for the University as a whole (42%).



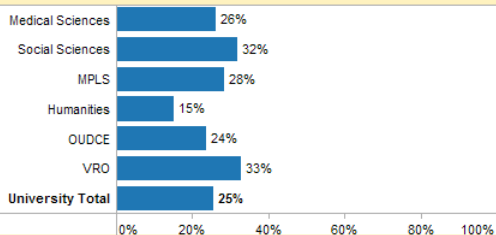
There are fewer women than men in both the University and the College for MPLS in all 3 categories (PGR, PGT and UG). Women make up the greatest numbers compared to men in the Humanities and Medical Sciences at UG level.

Ethnicity - Division Overview

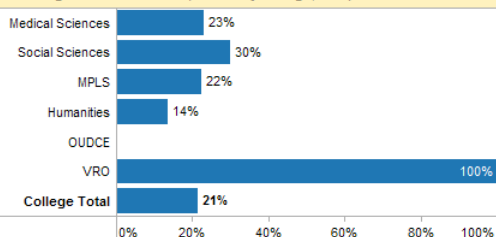

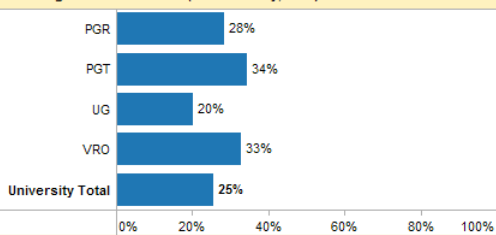

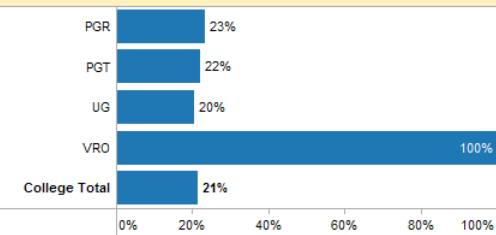

The College percentages for BME graduate students and undergraduate students are lower compared to the University as a whole. The pattern was similar in 2012, although the figure for undergraduate students was slightly higher in the College compared to the University overall. The highest proportion of BMEs at the College is from the Asian and Chinese ethnic groups (16%) and the lowest is from the Black and Arab ethnic groups (1%). In comparison, the overall University figures are 17% for the Asian and Chinese ethnic groups and 3% for the Black and Arab ethnic groups.

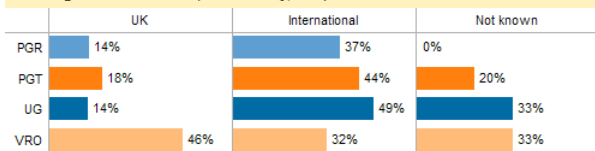

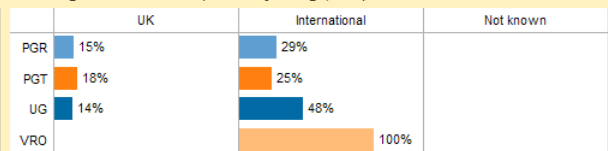

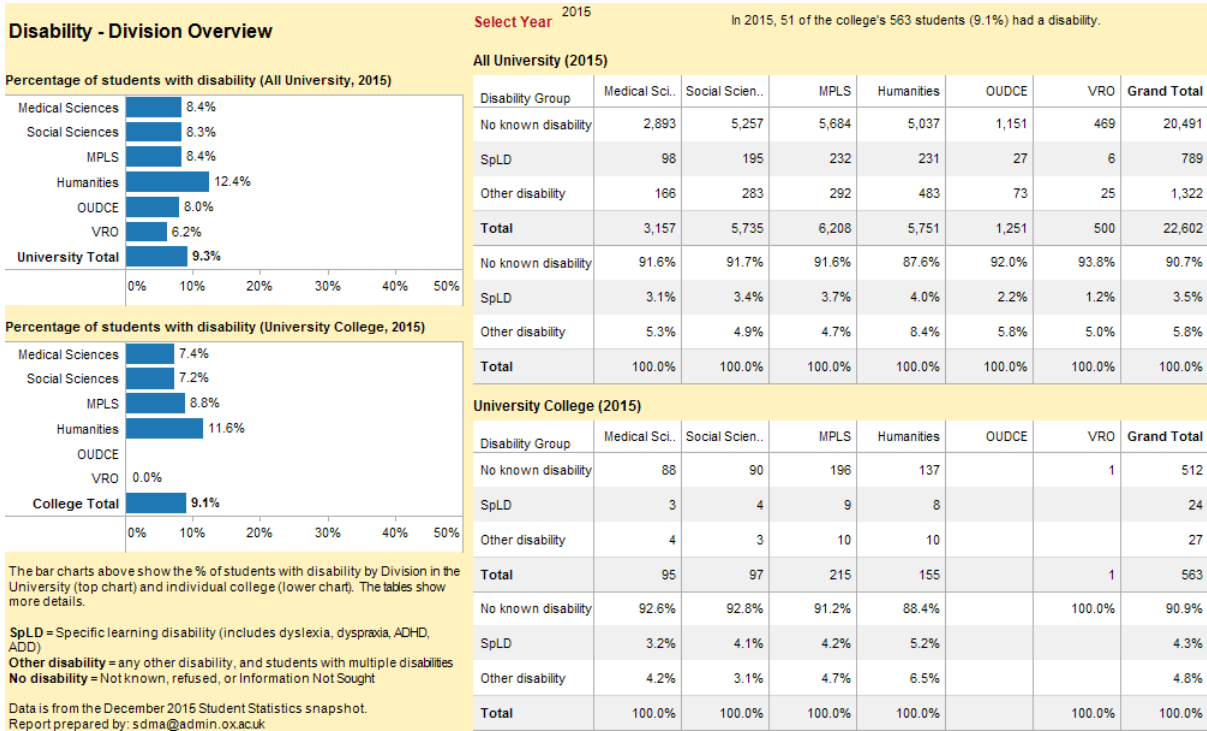
