### Stipendiary Lectureship (4 hours) in Physics

Applications are invited for a Stipendiary Lectureship in Physics, tenable for 12 months from 1 October 2026 to 30 September 2027, with the possibility of an extension to two or three years.

The successful candidate will be required to undertake a stint of four weighted hours of tutorials per week to undergraduates in Physics, averaged over three eight-week terms. Tutorials involve a group of typically three students who have been asked to complete and assignment which is the basis for the tutorial meeting.

The candidates should explain which parts of the first- and second-year course they feel able and prepared to teach and whether they would be able to teach any of the third year B-papers. Syllabus details can be found at:

The stipend will be in the range £11,270-£12,446 p.a. (depending on experience). This is a fixed-term post for twelve months (in the first instance) only. The appointee will have access to a teaching room in College and will be entitled to a number of lunches and dinners free of charge in College and to a number of other benefits.
